

FEBRUARY 11, 2024 SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Beloved in Christ,

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the Season of Lent. The Archdiocese provides this annual reminder:

"Ash Wednesday, Feb. 14 and Good Friday, March 29, are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast, that is, limited to a single full meal. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (canons 97, 1252). "Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with uplifted and clear mind." (Constitution on the Liturgy, No. 110)

With regard to the obligatory days listed above, however, there are frequent questions about the degree of seriousness of the matter. To paraphrase Pope John Paul II: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe an individual day of penance is not considered serious. People should seek to do more rather than less. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion."

I invite you to clear your Monday evenings in Lent for our Family Lenten Series that includes my Lenten discussions titled **The Pillars of Lent**, **The Feasts of Lent**, and **The Mark of Lent** on Feb. 26, March 4, and March 11, respectively. The series kicks off Feb. 19 with a FORMED presentation on the topic of Mercy, which is very timely for Lent.

The presentations will be in St. Brigid's lunchroom at 7 p.m. The first four Mondays will lead up to the Lenten Mission in our St. Michael the Archangel Family of Parishes. Fr. Nathan Cromley will guide us in mission March 17-19 (*more information on page 14*).

Our silent and prayerful presence saves lives as we participate in 40 Days for Life at our local abortion facility. **Today (Sunday) at 2 p.m.** is the kickoff for the Lenten/Spring campaign of 40 Days for Life outside the abortion facility at E. Stroop and Vineyard Ave. in Kettering. Many women who were abortion minded witness that they changed their minds when they noticed us praying for them to reconsider. They thank us that they gave the gift of life to their children. As Christians, Jesus calls us to bring his goodness to the evil we find in the world. This is an excellent way to answer that call (*more information on page 14*).

Even though Ash Wednesday is not a holy day, many people participate in Mass as the perfect prayer for kicking off the Season of Lent. We will offer nine Masses in our St. Michael the Archangel Family of Parishes, as shown on the bulletin cover.

World Marriage Day is celebrated today, the Sunday before St. Valentine's Day. How will you celebrate your marriage? Make a plan now with any parish to receive the Marriage Blessing on your anniversary.

Next Saturday, Feb. 17, I will be helping with confessions at the E6 Catholic Men's Conference. I invite all our men to participate. There are still spots available, and it's only a 70-minute drive from our area.

Lent begins early this year with Ash Wednesday falling on February 14, Valentine's Day. Coincidentally, as we celebrate a day of love, we begin a season of preparation to celebrate the great feast of love, Easter. The 40 days of Lent allow us time to ready our hearts by our traditional practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Fasting allows us to focus on our dependence on God, not the world. The Church asks us to fast and abstain as follows:

Abstinence—to refrain from eating meat: **all Fridays during Lent**. Catholics 14 years and older are expected to observe abstinence.

Fasting—to limit food to a single full meal or two half meals. Catholics from 18-59 are expected to observe fasting. Ash Wednesday (February 14) and Good Friday (March 29) are days of abstinence and fasting.

Prayer offers us the opportunity to grow closer to the Lord. In addition to personal prayer at home, come spend time before the Blessed Sacrament on Tuesdays from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m.

We will pray the Stations of the Cross in church every Friday beginning at 7:15 p.m. This simple, traditional prayer takes about 30 minutes and leads us to reflect on Christ's love for us.

Almsgiving calls us to action through donating money or goods to the poor and performing specific acts of charity. Many people "give up" excess material goods, foods, etc. from their lives so they are free to focus on the needs of others. Consider donating to the Bethel Churches United Food Pantry this month as one way of giving alms.


