#### MARCH 3, 2024 THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

### **Beloved** in Christ,

Please join me on Monday for my Lenten series. My topic is "The Feasts of Lent." What to do with feasts in a time of fasts? We meet at 7 p.m. in the lunchroom at St. Brigid.

Thanks for keeping the Elect in your prayers! They reach another important milestone in their journey into the Church with the Scrutinies today and the next two Sundays. I look forward to welcoming them into the Church with the sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil.

God answers prayers! We have been begging God for years to help us stop the killing of the innocents at 1401 E. Stroop Road. Perhaps we prayed on site during a 40 Days for Life campaign, or some other time of year. Our prayers are made in church, at home and other random locations. The abortionists have not been performing abortions there for about a month due to a broken water pipe. With an average of 10 abortions per day, lives have been saved. Sadly, they refer women to other facilities and administer chemical abortions. But many will have second thoughts or take this as "a sign" to choose life for their children.

Join me and other members of our St. Michael the Archangel Family of Parishes on Fridays of Lent in silent prayerful witness on site for 40 Days for Life. More information is on page 14. Also listed is informatin about a Project Rachel retreat. If someone you know needs healing from the effects of abortion, Project Rachel is ready to help at hopeafterabortion.com.

Fun question: I was recently asked about the timing of the prayers we recite at the end of weekday Mass, why one seems to happen in the sanctuary and the other on the floor level. All our parishes pray the "St. Michael defend us in battle..." at the end of Mass. I'm not sure what the other priests do, but when there is no music, I process out during the prayer.

Plus, I tack on a Hail Mary after that. First, the Hail Mary is an excellent way to pray two passages of St. Luke's Gospel. Secondly, we ask for the Blessed Mother's intercession. Third, right in the middle we get the chance to bend the knee at the name of Jesus in fulfillment of Philippians 2:10. Finally, it makes the name of Jesus the last one we say together rather than that of the devil from the St. Michael prayer.

Thanks for your prayers. Be assured of my daily prayers for you.





#### Lenten Reflection

In this gospel the Third Sunday of Lent, Jesus demonstrates the importance of having a pure heart through his actions in the temple. Another way to purify our hearts is through prayer and reflection. By spending time in prayer and meditating on God's Word, we can allow the Holy Spirit to work within us and transform our hearts. We can also ask God to help us identify areas of our lives that need to be purified, and to give us the strength and courage to make the necessary changes.






