



MARCH 17, 2024 FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Beloved in Christ,

I look forward to being with you at our Lenten Mission beginning Sunday evening. Each of the Mission's three evening schedules include different themes, different food, and different locations. Doors open for an encounter with Jesus at 4 p.m. all three nights. More details are listed on the previous page.

Our seventh and eighth graders from St. Brigid, St. Paul and St. Augustine parishes receive the Sacrament of Confirmation today (Sunday). Please keep them in your prayers as they receive this important sacrament and all its supernatural gifts.

Looking ahead: We plan to move the 8:30 a.m. Mass on Saturdays from St. Brigid to St. Luke beginning April 6. Three of the four priests who offer this Mass live at St. Luke, while none live at St. Brigid, thus cutting down on driving and mileage expenses. Moreover, we hope the momentum of having 50-70 people at the 8:30 a.m. Mass Monday through Friday at St. Luke will continue into Saturday morning. I have always enjoyed the experience of Saturday morning Mass. Many people are off work and want to be there because of their love for the Lord. And many observe the devotion of the Blessed Virgin Mary, including observance of the First Saturdays.

What's the deal with some churches covering images on the Fifth Sunday of Lent? Explanations abound online; here's one:

Today is the third and final scrutiny for the Elect. Only two weeks until the three sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil! Please keep the Elect in your prayers as we look forward to welcoming them home for the beginning their journey of grace.

This coming Tuesday is election day in Ohio. Here's my two-step process I have found helpful when discerning who is the best candidate: 1) The perfect candidate does not exist because the Lord Jesus does not run for public office. 2) Who is going to limit evil the most? Of course, this entails that the Catholic voter knows what is good and what is evil through a catechesis that has aided in developing a well well-formed conscience.

As the Lenten season comes to an end, let's finish strong. Please consider praying at 40 Days for Life and 40 Hours Devotion of the Eucharist. More details are on page 14.





Brothers and Sisters of the St. Michael Family,

It was a great joy to celebrate the most sacred time of the year as a family of parishes last year. We kept the Holy Week and Easter schedule almost exactly the same as before our parishes were joined together by Beacons of Light, and for the most part, this worked really well. We had many, prayerful liturgies. Our schedule for Holy Week and Easter this year will be the same as last year's, with two exceptions.

First, the only Holy Week liturgies to be poorly attended last year were the Easter Vigils. Because we want the most important, holiest Mass of the year to be the biggest and most joyful, we are therefore combining these into one, single Easter Vigil Mass for the whole family of parishes. This first year of combining, it will be held at St. Luke, and we will subsequently rotate to other parishes, starting with Mary, Help of Christians next year.

Every single parish will be united in making this one celebration an incredible encounter with Jesus in the sacraments. We will have a cantor and lector from every parish, members from every choir present, and all of our priests celebrating the Mass together for the first time. This will be a beautiful liturgy and a powerful moment to unite in Holy Communion and receive many graces from the Risen Lord together, as a family.

A second change is that we will add one extra Mass at St. Brigid on Easter morning at 11 a.m. Since their single Sunday Mass is currently pretty full, and we have a priest available to say an extra Mass, we can make that accommodation this year.

Thank you so much for continuing to pray together with us through this Lenten season. Knowing of all your prayerful support, we priests are looking forward to the intense beauty and sanctity of this upcoming Holy Week.

Catholic Social Teaching

-As Catholics view the world and all of its needs, we can look to seven key principles recognized by the Church to guide us in responding to those around us. In previous Social Actions Newsletters, we examined the first five principles. In this edition, we'll examine the last two.

SOLIDARITY

We hear about injustice, poverty, war and suffering all over the world. Although these things may be happening in distant locations, we are called to help those who are experiencing hardship. The suffering of our fellow humans is a concern for all of us. How can we help? Contributions to Catholic Relief Services, keeping informed about the plight of others, speaking up for justice, teaching those around us about problems experienced in the world, and prayer for the suffering are ways that we can express our solidarity.

CARE FOR GOD'S CREATION

We hear so much about global warming, extinction, pollution, and other buzzwords that sometimes we think there is nothing that can be done to fix the problems. In Genesis God commanded that we take care of the Earth.

. Concern for the environment thus needs to be joined to a sincere love for our fellow human beings and an unwavering commitment to resolving the problems of society." (Pope Francis, *On Care for Our Common Home* [Laudato Si'],nos. 49, 91)

We are called to protect people and the Earth living our faith in relationship with all of God's creation. (USCCB)

We will examine ways to apply these seven principles in subsequent newsletters.

SOLAR SITING AND MICRO-GRIDS



The sun is the source of all living creatures. Without the sun, none of us would be reading this. Today most of us are using limited natural resources to heat our homes and to power our vehicles and electronic devices. The power of the sun is virtually unlimited. But are we using its potential?

Power from solar panels is becoming increasingly competitive with fossil fuel, even without government subsidies. Where should solar panels be located? Too often finding locations for them becomes difficult and confusing.

"Corporate solar" requires large acreage, often farm (food) land, and close proximity to regional electrical grids. Neighbors of such projects often oppose their construction and operation. In contrast, small-scale "Community solar" uses roof tops, parking lots, and vacant fields of modest size. In many cases, this alternative has a cooperative funding structure that avoids the unintended consequences of the corporate process.

Recently Pope Francis published Laudato Deum, an apostolic exhortation subtitled "To all People of Good Will on the Climate Crisis." Note that the intended audience is not just Catholics. This exhortation is a follow-on to Laudato Si that Pope Francis published eight years ago. In Laudato Deum he explicitly challenges the climate deniers and exhorts us all to do something to reverse the trend of increasing global temperature and extreme events.

In a related turn, an article in the recent "Christians for the Mountains" newsletter encourages Christian churches to consider forming a "micro-grid" using solar cells and batteries. Such churches could serve as a place of refuge for neighbors during a loss of power - a place of heat in the winter, cool in the summer – and to even provide charging plugs for electronics. As a significant fringe benefit, the micro-grid can reduce the church's dependence on fossil fuels and save money over time.

What a neat way to make Pope Francis happy – not to mention all of our future generations.




