

Vison Statement Reflection

ast week, Fr. Bedel unveiled the vision statement for the St. Michael the Archangel Family of Parishes in his bulletin column. As he promised, each of us vicars will be reflecting on this statement over the next few weeks. I invite you to read the statement prayerfully, so that the Holy Spirit can guide us toward what He wants to do here in our parishes.

I want to focus on the first verb in the vision statement: "Aspires." To me, this is a very powerful verb that expresses what a vision statement is, and what our attitude needs to be toward God's grace. To aspire is to long for something good and beautiful. Our aspirations are the things we dream about achieving in our life.

statement is supposed to do a vision statement sets in front of us the goal that we're all working toward. This statement of our goal is then paired with a mission statement, which describes how we plan to get to that goal. Those two together - vision and mission, aspiration and plan - lay out the destination we want to reach and the way to get there.

This describes what a vision

The word "aspire" is deeper than just a goal, though. It comes from the Latin word for "to breathe." It conjures up the image of a sprinter, breathing hard, gasping in air so that he can reach the finish line, or a mountain climber depending on the oxygen in the air so

he can reach the summit. What we aspire to is the thing that we're breathing for. It's what gives purpose to our every breath. In this sense, the vision statement for our family of parishes is the beautiful vision of what the Holy Spirit, God Himself, is planning to do in our midst. Everything we do, from the biggest to the smallest, from Masses to janitorial service, is all part of "breathing" - longing for the incredible things that God is going to do among us.

We need to make sure that our aspirations are high enough! The Holy Spirit has infinite power to transform our lives, our parishes, and our cities

> and towns. God has more than enough grace to fulfill all of our longings. It would be a terrible waste to set the bar low, and only ask for a little help! And so we wrote a vision statement that includes incredible things that we might all become saints. That might seem like an

unattainable goal, and on our own, it would be. But we are not on our own!

God desires to make us holy. God desires to make us saints. Jesus suffered and died on the cross, and rose from the dead, to save us from our sins and make us like Himself. If that is his vision for us, then we can't set our sights any lower. We need to aspire to greatness, because it's what Jesus wants for us. He wants to do great things in us, and so we need to learn to aspire for greatness in Him.


