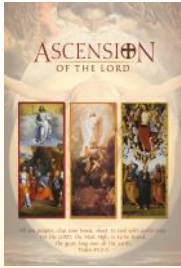

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has asked Catholics throughout our nation to reawaken our love for and trust in the true presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. This is why the USCCB is coordinating a nation-wide Eucharistic Revival, asking priests and laypeople to profess our love to Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament, and refocus our practice of Catholicism on what Jesus does for us at every Mass. There are many reasons why this is important right now: people's experience of the Eucharist was disrupted by the pandemic, the Eucharist is the Sacrament of unity in a world that is so profoundly divided, and we need the grace that Jesus gives from the Eucharist to be the "Source and Summit" of the renewal we desire. This same centrality of the Eucharist is at the heart of the Beacons of Light process here in our own Archdiocese. Archbishop Schnurr said the goal of this whole process "...is that our parishes truly become "beacons of light" – strong, joyful communities of evangelization and service centered on the Eucharist."

One way that I would like to help our parish here at Mary, Help of Christians, place Jesus' Presence in the Eucharist at the center of our life is to relocate the tabernacle in the sanctuary. Currently, the tabernacle is off to the left side, still visible, but not the center. I would like set the tabernacle, where Jesus chooses to stay present to us in our parish, at the center of the sanctuary, where the presider's chair currently is. The chair for the priest and deacon would be relocated to the right side of the altar, and a devotional image of the Blessed Mother will be placed where the tabernacle was.

Moving the tabernacle will truly help our parish give reverence to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Currently, the central point of focus in the church is the priest's chair. And, of course, Jesus is present in many ways during the Mass, including his presence in the priest, who acts *in persona Christi*. But of all the ways in which Jesus is present, his real Presence in the Eucharist is the most important. The USCCB made this very clear in their document announcing the Eucharistic Revival: "Though Christ is present to us in many ways in the liturgy, including in the assembly gathered, the presiding minister, and the word proclaimed, the Church also clearly affirms that the mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique." Thus, putting the tabernacle in the center, in line with the altar where Jesus becomes present anew in every Mass, keeps our focus on Him and what He does for us in the Eucharist.

This also resolves a practical problem. Currently, it takes a good little while to walk all the way to the tabernacle to retrieve the Eucharist during Mass. Moving the tabernacle to the center will make getting ready to distribute Holy Communion, and purifying the sacred vessels afterwards, much more efficient.

I first floated the idea of moving the tabernacle to our Parish Council and our Parish Worship Commission back in the fall. I didn't expect the project to move very quickly – I wanted to make sure I got feedback from those important representatives of the parishioners, and I figured that it would take some time to make a plan. Both groups approved the idea, and it turned out the physical task of moving the tabernacle would be easier than I expected. So, I would like to propose relocating the tabernacle in time for the feast of Corpus Christi, which is Sunday, June 11th.

I want to extend the idea to all of you. I really want the whole parish to be involved in the conversation. I will plan to host an evening of adoration with a talk on the Eucharist on June 5th at 7pm, explaining more about Church architecture, Jesus' True Presence, and how we can love Jesus more as a parish. If you have concerns or questions, please come and listen! You are also welcome to get in touch with me personally if you are worried about this change. 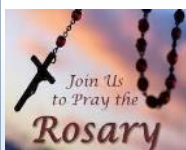

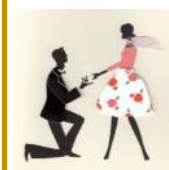
