We will recommission all of our Extraordinary Ministers at every parish in our family at our Masses on the feast of Corpus Christi, June 10th and 11th. **We will have two training sessions for any new Extraordinary Ministers, or any current ones who want a refresher and an opportunity to pray together:** 7:00PM on Wednesday, May 31st at Mary, Help of Christians, and 7:00PM on Tuesday, June 6th at St. Brigid. LITURGICAL COLORS

Liturgical Colors

Have you ever wondered why the colors in our church change throughout the year? Each color symbolizes a liturgical season or a particular day in our church calendar. The colors also represent particular qualities. This Sunday, the fifty-day Easter season will conclude with Pentecost, the birthday of the Church. Our colors will be red to symbolize the flames of the Holy Spirit. After Pentecost Sunday, we will begin the second round of Ordinary (as in ordered or numbered) Time, which is green. Don't be confused on the following Sunday, though. June 4 is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, so we change back to white for this Sunday. We will make the same change on Sunday, June 11 for the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). After that, you will begin to see the green on Sundays, just as you have been seeing it on the week days of Ordinary Time. Are you still asking why white or why green? Green symbolizes the hope we have with faith. White symbolizes Christ, purity, victory over death and joy among other things, and therefore, used for our most holy solemnities and seasons, as well as funerals. Stay tuned for more color explanations late this fall when we look toward Advent.

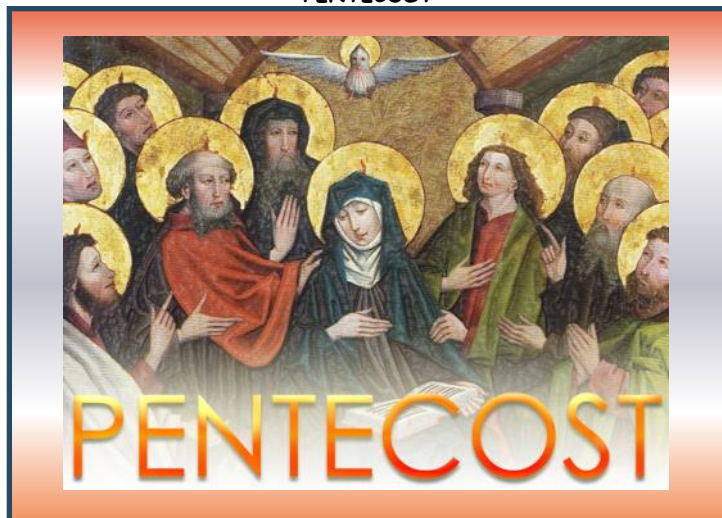

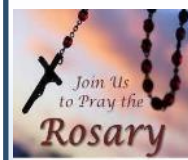

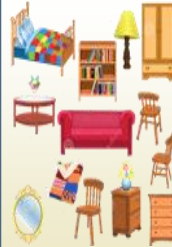
