From The Pastor's Desk

Beloved in Christ,

With the start of school this week, we keep the children of our two schools and their teachers in our prayers. Our schools are the largest ministries of St. Luke and St. Brigid parishes; and every ministry of every parish exists to make disciples of Jesus Christ. Moreover, all of our parishes have excellent catechetical programs.

In infant baptism, parents promise to be the first and best teachers of the Faith to their children. We take seriously the responsibility of partnering with parents in this monumental task. For this same reason, we have religious in-service programs for teachers and a retreat for catechists in the coming week. May the Lord Jesus bless us as we make, mold and mission disciples after his own heart.

Please plan to join me in a 54-day Novena of Prayer which begins on Sept. 15, the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows. Some groups of people who are greatly mislead will spend millions of dollars in Ohio between now and election day on Nov. 7 trying to get us to pass an amendment to our state's constitution to enshrine the "right" for big people to kill little people just because they are unwanted and in the womb. Please see Archbishop Schnurr's letter in this bulletin. There are also links at catholicaoc.org and ohiocathconf.org with other details.

May the prayers of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who stayed by her Son as he died on the cross, come to the throne of God and convert the hearts of the people of our state. Archbishop Schnurr reminds us our task is "to pray earnestly for the defeat of this extreme amendment; to educate ourselves and our families and friends about the dangers of the proposed amendment; and to vote NO on Nov. 7."



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On November 7, 2023, Ohioans will have the opportunity to demonstrate how our state views the sacredness of life and the dignity of women. On the November ballot will be a proposed amendment (deceptively named "The Right to Reproductive Freedom with Protections for Health and Safety") to the Ohio Constitution that would enshrine the "right" to take the lives of innocent children in the womb while harming women and families in the process.

An expectant mother of any age can face many challenges, including lack of support from the father, financial strains, concerns about her own health and that of her child, and pressures from family and friends, Every woman, regardless of circumstances, should be able to depend upon a community of support. That is why Catholic social service agencies, in collaboration with many other faith-based and secular organizations, assist pregnant women in need with material resources and personal accompaniment, both during pregnancy and after their child is born.

By contrast, the proposed amendment does none of that. If enacted, it would amend the Constitution of Ohio to effectively:

- Put women at risk. This amendment would enable elimination of some of the most basic, fundamental safety regulations on abortion clinics, including the current requirement for an abortion to be performed by a licensed physician.
- Threaten parental rights. The vague language in the amendment opens the door to anyone under 18 having an abortion, or even beginning cross-sex hormone treatment, without parental consent or notification.
- Allow abortion through 9 months of pregnancy. The amendment provides caveats such that a healthy, fully-formed infant in the womb who otherwise could be delivered with no issues would still be a candidate for a surgical dismemberment abortion.

We must reject this extraordinary and dangerous attempt to radically reshape Ohio through a constitutional amendment that does nothing to aid women or promote life.

The amendment's supporters will claim that its passage is necessary to preserve medical treatment for women who experience miscarriages or ectopic pregnancies. This is not true. No Ohio laws – or the laws of any U.S. state, for that matter – prevent such treatment. Hospitals, including Catholic hospitals, and physicians have always provided comprehensive miscarriage care, and will continue to do so regardless of the outcome of this vote.

Some may insist that the Catholic Church should not be involved in politics. However, the defense of life and care for women compels our participation in this critical moral issue. As Catholics, we are morally obliged to uphold the dignity of life of all vulnerable humans – immigrants, the poor, preborn children. We cannot remain silent on a direct ballot question like the one in November. The Church must not remain on the sidelines when confronted with such a clear threat to human life and dignity and the primacy of the family.

Ohio does not need a constitutional amendment that only perpetuates violence and a culture of death. I urge Catholics and all people of goodwill to pray earnestly for the defeat of this extreme amendment; to educate yourselves and your family and friends about the dangers of the proposed amendment; and to vote NO on November 7. Beyond that, we must continue our commitment to caring for women, children and families.

May the Blessed Virgin Mary, mother of our Lord and Savior, and St. Joseph, protector of the family, intercede for Ohio and its families in the weeks ahead.



An amendment to the Ohio state constitution is being proposed and will be on the ballot this November which, if passed, will enshrine the right to take the lives of innocent children in the womb while harming women and families in the process. As we continue our efforts to assist pregnant women in need with material resources and personal accompaniment, it is also paramount that we inform people of the ways this amendment would put women at risk, threaten parental rights, and allow abortion through nine months of pregnancy. We will be taking up a second collection on Aug. 26 and 27 at all of our NE3 Family of Parishes. Proceeds from this collection will be divided such that half of the monies raised will benefit pregnancy care centers and agencies across the Archdiocese of Cincinnati and half would fund efforts to inform Ohioans on the need to reject the deadly amendment. Prayerfully consider joining others in donating to this second collection.



POLLINATORS: BEES, BIRDS AND BUTTERFLIES

In our current fragile environment, the need for food production is essential for keeping the world's population fed. According to National Geographic, one third of the food consumed by humans is a result of pollinators doing their job on our farms and in our backyard gardens.

Thus, we should offer these pollinators plants that attract them. Consider the space and type of plant that suits your garden. It is helpful to select plants that bloom at various times across the growing season.

The following list will help you get started: Calendula, Pincushion, Bachelor Buttons, Marigold, Salvia, Nasturtium, Lavender, Cosmos, Verbena, Borage, Anise Hyssop, Heliotrope, Yarrow, Oregano, Sunflowers, Coneflowers, Zinnia, Blazing Meadow Star, Penstemon, Aster, Goldenrod, Bee Balm.


