Family to choose canonical parish name, all parishioners have opportunity to nominate patron

> While the names of the churches that make up the Northeast 3 Family of Parishes *will not change*, the Code of Canon Law requires patrons be named to intercede for the people of the new combined parish.

An insert included in this bulletin lists the guidelines for naming such saints in accordance with Canon Law. The chosen saint, or saints (*see insert explanation*), will also replace the temporary title of "Northeast 3" as the family name.

Parish leaders are seeking patron suggestions from parishioners **through Oct. 1**. A link to submit suggestions electronically will be sent via locknote, and the back of the insert has space for parishioners to write their suggestions.

Hand-written nominations can be placed in collection baskets or dropped off at parish offices.

Parishioners are strongly encouraged to clearly explain the reason for their nomination. Submissions lacking any basis for why a nomination was presented may not receive as much consideration.

The grand revealing of the family's new name (date to be determined) is expected to be first announced via Flocknote.

# PICK YOUR PATRON NE3 Seeking Suggestions for Canonical Parish Name

While the names of the churches that make up the Northeast 3 Family of Parishes *will not change*, the Code of Canon Law requires a saint be named as intercessor for the people of the new combined parish.

The chosen saint will also replace "Northeast 3" as the family name and NE3 leadership is seeking saint suggestions from all parishioners. Below are Canon guidelines and considerations for naming parishes.

Saint suggestions, along with a description of why that saint (or saints, *see below*) should be considered, *can be written on the back of this form. Completed forms can be placed in collection baskets or dropped off at parish offices through Oct. 1.* 

- The final canonical parish name will identify the parish each church belongs to, for example, St. Augustine Church of St. (insert name) Parish
- The following are the possible patrons: the Blessed Virgin Mary, under some title already accepted into the sacred liturgy, the Angels, and the Saints
- When two or more saints are inscribed in the Roman Calendar together, they may together be chosen as the principal patrons
- The three Divine Persons are always excluded from possible patrons because the patron is to be the principal intercessor for the people of the place before the Divine Persons themselves
- Choosing the patron of a church already part of the Archdiocese is not prohibited, though choosing a unique name can avoid confusion going forward
- A "Blessed" may only be chosen as a patron with an indult granted by the Apostolic See



# Special Second Collection August 26 & 27 this weekend

An amendment to the Ohio state constitution is being proposed and will be on the ballot this November which, if passed, will enshrine the right to take the lives of innocent children in the womb while harming women and families in the process. As we continue our efforts to assist pregnant women in need with material resources and personal accompaniment, it is also paramount that we inform people of the ways this amendment would put women at risk, threaten parental rights, and allow abortion through nine months of pregnancy. We will be taking up a second collection on Aug. 26 and 27 at all of our NE3 Family of Parishes. Proceeds from this collection will be divided such that half of the monies raised will benefit pregnancy care centers and agencies across the Archdiocese of Cincinnati and half would fund efforts to inform Ohioans on the need to reject the deadly amendment. Prayerfully consider joining others in donating to this second collection.

# WHERE DOES IT SAY THAT?



#### THIS CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT...

#### **THREATENS PARENTAL RIGHTS**

By using "individual" instead of adult or woman, anyone under the age of 18 could have an abortion or make any other reproductive decision without their parents' consent or notification.

#### **PUTS WOMEN AT RISK**

Current Ohio laws\* require abortion providers to explain procedure risks and ensure access to hospital transfer if needed. These health and safety standards could be seen as a "burden" and be eliminated, making it even less safe for women seeking an abortion.

#### ALLOWS ABORTIONS THROUGH 9 MONTHS OF PREGNANCY

In U.S. law,\*\* "health" includes age or physical, emotional, or psychological well-being. This means a woman's age or emotional health could be cited to justify aborting a full-term baby. An abortionproviding physician would decide when a baby could survive outside the womb, leaving no clear protections for preborn children.

#### IS MISLEADING

Referring to "miscarriage care" promotes a myth that a "right to abortion" is necessary to preserve care for miscarriages and ectopic pregnancies. This is false. Catholic hospitals have always provided comprehensive miscarriage care and will continue to do so regardless of the outcome of this vote.

#### **ARTICLE I, SECTION 22**

The Right to Reproductive Freedom with Protections for Health and Safety

- Every individual has a right to make and carry out one's own reproductive decisions, including but not limited to decisions on contraception, fertility treatment, continuing one's own pregnancy, miscarriage care, and abortion.
- 2. The State shall not, directly or indirectly, burden, penalize, prohibit, interfere with, or discriminate against either an individual's voluntary exercise of this right or a person or entity that assists an individual exercising this right, unless the State demonstrates that it is using the least restrictive means to advance the individual's health in accordance with widely accepted and evidence-based standards of care.
- 3. However, abortion may be prohibited after fetal viability. But in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician it is necessary to protect the pregnant patient's life or health.
- 4. As used in this Section, "Fetal viability" means "the point in a pregnancy when, in the professional judgment of the pregnant patient's treating physician, the fetus has a significant likelihood of survival outside the uterus with reasonable measures. This is determined on a case-by-case basis"; and "State" includes any governmental entity and political subdivision.
- 5. This Section is self-executing.



# A TALE OF WORK, WAR, LOVE, AND THE TIES THAT BIND ST. PADRE PIO, PAUL PITSTICK, AND ST. PAUL PARISH by Paul Pitstick

have the hands of a Midwestern farmboy. They are weathered and coarse. They are sun-dried and calloused. They are tired and bruised. My hands have tilled soil and planted seeds. They look every bit of the ninety-three years of life I have lived.

I have the hands of a husband. They have fixed cars and changed lightbulbs. They have stained the fence and changed the oil. They have mown the lawn andtaken out the garbage. My hands are uniquely formed to hold the hand of my bride of seventy years. They never feel quite as good as when they are in hers.

I have the hands of a father, grandfather, and great-grandfather. Theyhave changed diapers of forty-five of the most beautiful children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren a man could ask for. They have dried tears, played catch, wrapped presents, rocked cribs, tickled toes, and fed each child with love. I have the hands of a son. They shook my father's hand as I left for World War II, and they held my mother tight when I returned home. They have gripped the shovel as I buried both of my earthly parents. My hands have opened the good book written by my Heavenly Father. They have held the Body of Jesus Christ every day for over seventy years.

Ultimately my hope rests not in the work of my own hands, but in the hands of Jesus. Jesus has been with me every day of my life. I felt this most powerfully theday I kissed the wounds of Christ on the hands of the great saint Padre Pio.

I met Padre Pio during my third year serving as a bomb site auto pilot mechanic in World War II. When the war ended, I was asked to remain in Europe for an extra year of service. My family contacted me from home in Ohio and told me they thought I was stationed near San Giovanni Rotondo, where Padre Pio lived.

Sure enough, when I looked at my map, I realized I was in the town right next to San Giovanni Rotondo. Can you believe that? What are the chances? It had to have been the Lord!

The first time I met Padre Pio, he allowed a group of us to kiss the glove covering the stigmata on his palm. What a grace! I was deeply moved by his presence. There was something different about Padre Pio. His presence was weightier than others'. He was always joyful, always smiling, despite his painful wounds. It was a gift for him to

suffer with the Lord. I felt closer to God when I was with Padre Pio, and I couldn't wait to visit him again.

God gave me the opportunity to visit Padre Pio on four occasions during my time in Italy. I remember him inviting a fellow soldier and me to kneel before the altar as he said Mass. We were so close to him that we could clearly see the stigmata on his palms as he celebrated the Eucharist. He always took off his gloves for Mass.

We received the Body of Christ from those hands. Later, he invited me to kneel in front of him, placing his right hand on my head and holding his left hand out in front of me. I kissed the wound of Christ in Padre Pio's flesh. That experience was such a special grace. I think about it every day.

The only time I spoke to Padre Pio was to ask him to pray for my sister and father, who were both in poor health. My mother had written me from home to request this prayer intention from him.

After hearing my request, he said to me, "I will keep them in the palm of my hand." I knew they would be taken care of. And they were.

I can feel Padre Pio with me all the time. I know he is praying for me and my family. On the day Padre Pio died,

> the bells at our church tolled miraculously for almost three hours. The janitor had to clip the wire near the bells to make them stop.

I could hear the bells tolling out on the farm nearly a mile away. That was Padre Pio''s way of saying goodbye to us. Sometimes when I close my eyes, I can still hear those bells ringing and I smile.

The saints are beacons of hope in the world. They show us that ordinary men and women can be the living hands of Jesus acting in the world. Saints show the world that God does powerful things through those that make themselves available to him.

Padre Pio gives me hope that one life can make a difference in another. He gives me hope that my hands can do God's work. Even through a simple Midwestern farmer, husband, father, and son, God can bring hope into the world. If God can make a saint out of an ordinary man like Padre Pio, he can do the same thing with you and me.

In my life, hope has been found in people. It is through people that God has shown me how he loves to do the extraordinary through the ordinary. My wife is my hope. My children, grand-

> children, and great-grandchildren are my hope. Padre Pio is my hope. Jesus is my hope. You are my hope.

> Yes, you reading this, you are my hope. You are a gift from God to the world. You hold within you the hope of a greater and more beautiful Church. You hold within you the hope that this can become

a nation of holy families and saintly priests and religious. You hold within you the hope that love can prevail over hate. You hold within you the hope that God will bring the wonderful message of salvation to every corner of the earth.
