

Congratulations to **everyone graduating** at various levels of education at this time of year! How will we now apply what we have learned for the advancement of the Kingdom of God?

Monday, May 26, is Memorial Day. We will have an extra Mass at St. Brigid Cemetery at 8 a.m. We will also have our regularly scheduled Masses at St. Luke at 8:30 a.m. and at Mary, Help of Christians at 7:45 a.m. This is a great way for us to show our gratitude and **remember those who gave all in defending our country**.

St. Michael to be only Family near Dayton with Perpetual Adoration

When I was a young person, I was occasionally asked, "Who would you like to meet if you could meet any person throughout history?" I am reasonably sure that I responded with the name of a sports figure, or maybe some great military leader. Today, I would reframe the question to "Who would you like to spend an hour with?" The extremely easy answer: Jesus Christ.

This has been true for many years now. At some point, I came to understand that Christ really is the center of my entire life. There is no one esle I would prefer to spend time with. Most days, that means spending time in prayer.

But occasionally, because of the blessing we have in Eucharistic Adoration, I am able to actually be in the Lord's presence, to speak to and listen to Him, to have a one-on-one conversation. This is possible because of the many opportunities we have for Adoration in our St. Michael the Archangel Family of Parishes.

In these hours spent with our Lord, I have found the ultimate purpose and meaning of my life. I have also come to understand that Jesus has a plan for me, and everything that has happened, that is happening and that will happen, are all part of His



plan. Even in those times I may be led astray by my own brokenness and wounded nature, He demonstrates how He will simply use my failings to my benefit.

After practicing daily prayer for a number of years now, I honestly do not understand how anyone can make it through the day without spending time with Jesus. I simply could not do it. I need His support, guidance, comfort, and counsel.

Going to Him within limited hours of Adoration, however, hasn't always been easy. Schedules have to line up. But that, for the St. Michael Family, is about to change.

We are embarking on the institution of Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration. Beginning on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi (**June 22**), we will have direct access to our Lord, exposed in the monstrance, twenty four hours a day, seven days a week, 364 days a year (there is no Adoration on Good Friday).

I hope many of our parishioners will take advantage of the remarkable gift we are about to receive. We will become the only Family of Parishes in the greater Dayton area to provide Perpetual Adoration. And I believe we will be a powerful blessing to many of our neighbors because of it.



Sixth Sunday of Easter

Talk about how, as a family, you can prepare for Pentecost (only two weeks away), when we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit, our Advocate.
