Beloved in Christ,

Come to St. Brigid at 2 p.m. today (Sunday) to celebrate and thank **Fr. Mike Holloran** for his service as a priest. After 43 years as a priest, he is retiring, so we celebrate his generous "yes."

The Third Order Carmelites, who meet regularly at St. Luke, invite everyone to Rosary, Vespers and Mass with Fr. John MacQuarrie, their chaplain, all beginning at 6:10 p.m this Wednesday. This is an excellent day to be enrolled in the brown scapular of **Our Lady of Mt. Carmel**. I invite anyone not enrolled to bring their scapulars to be enrolled by any priest after any Mass.

Please keep me in your prayers this week as I travel to Wheeling, W.Va, to participate in a **three-day priest conference** for continuing education with the St. Paul Center for Biblical Theology.

I look forward to seeing you at **Mary**, **Help of Christians' festival** next Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. More information is on page 6.

A few Sundays back, we celebrated the Solemnity of Saints
Peter and Paul. The last time it fell on a Sunday was 11 years
ago. I looked back at some old notes and was reminded of the drama that was
happening in our country then. It was a reminder for me of the need for all the Catholic
faithful to be engaged in our communities and reject the attitude that someone else will
handle it

We were observing the "Fortnight for Freedom" in 2014 under the leadership of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. The Department of Health and Human Services of the Executive Branch of the National government was mandating that health insurance programs pay for **things that are contrary to our Faith** and our understanding of the dignity of the human person.

Meanwhile, we were celebrating some awesome martyrs, many of whom were killed by governments as they witnessed to their faith. Feasts falling during that time were those of: Saints John Fisher, Thomas More, John the Baptist, Peter, Paul, 1st Martyrs of the Holy Roman Church because of Nero's persecution of the Church. St. Irenaeus is not considered a martyr by blood, but there is certainly the "white martyrdom" of laying down his life for souls at a difficult time. And in early July, we rounded it out with the feast of St. Thomas the Apostle and martyr.

In the drama of 2014, Cardinal Dolan of New York, pointed out that the federal government telling the Church that the Church's requirements of morality were met was **like telling Orthodox Jews what parts of their kosher diet are kosher enough**. The Little Sisters of the Poor were drug into a lawsuit that lasted for years.

Archbishop Schnurr allowed use of the Mass for Persecuted Christians, even on Sundays. He added that living our faith is not just about the 50 minutes we spend in church on Sunday, but our faith must influence everything we do for the other **167 hours of every week**. Therefore, our faith must influence society and country.

Moreover, the Archbishop pointed out that the HHS mandate essentially told owners to check their faith at the door when running a business. Your faith cannot influence the way you do business, HHS said, and you must provide your employees with things that destroy human life and the family.

Catholic Charities in many dioceses used to facilitate adoptions. Because of HHS and other policies chipping away at religious freedom, many dioceses had no choice but to get out of the adoption business, including those in Illinois, Washington D.C., Boston, and San Francisco.

It was good practical advice 11 years ago and it is good advice now. **We need to be informed, contact elected officials, and vote**. And we heed what St. Paul said: "For our struggle is not with flesh and blood but with the principalities, with the powers, with the world rulers of this present darkness, with the evil spirits in the heavens. Therefore, put on the armor of God, that you may be able to resist on the evil day and, having done everything, to hold your ground." (Eph. 6:12-13) How? We fast, pray, abstain from meat on Fridays, etc.

One trap the slippery slope offers is to compare our own government officials to Herod, Hitler, Stalin, and the like, thinking we will act when

things get worse. But God gives us freedom to serve the poor and vulnerable now. No government can take that away.

Thanks for your prayers. Be assured of my daily prayers for you.








St. Vincent de Paul collects monetary donations at the doors after Mass on the 3rd weekend of every month. Look




